Non-carcinogenic health risks due to F exposure through consumption of drinking water were assessed using the US EPA method. The health risk assessments were evaluated using hazard quotient (HQ), hazard index (HI), and lifetime cancer risk (CR). Results: The results of the HQ values of arsenic and heavy metals for combined pathways were below the safety level (HQ < 1) for adults, while the HI for children were higher than the safety limit in some stations.

Studies have shown that one drink a day increases the risk of breast cancer in women. Similarly, the health risk index (HRI) values exceeded the safe limits (>1) in many cities (eg, Cr and Ni in Lahore and As in Vehari, Jhang, Lahore, and Multan). The average daily intake of a food is the figure that is commonly employed in human health risk assessments. Market Facts (1991) used consumption frequency and portion size information to develop mean monthly intake figures for finfish, shellfish, and seafood.

While moderate alcohol use may offer some health benefits, heavy drinking — including binge drinking — has no health benefits. Heavy or high-risk drinking is defined as more than three drinks on any day or more than seven drinks a week for women and for men older than age 65, and more than four drinks on any day or more than 14 drinks a week for men age 65 and younger.

Assessment of the human health risk comprises qualitative and quantitative evaluation of the human's exposure to contamination originating mainly from environment and food, in particular in drinking water. The quality of water consumed has a strongly impact on our health and well-being.

Probabilistic risk assessments were obtained by applying Monte Carlo approach with consideration of uncertainty. The results indicated that in drinking water sources of WS-A, WS-C, and WS-D, maximum concentrations of As were 28 µg/L, 40 µg/L, and 17 µg/L, respectively, which were higher than 10 µg/L recommended by the World Health Organization occurred.
